A World with Apples and Stars




Answer these questions using the apple/star world shown above.



1. If this is the only rule, what will the kodu eat? Circle your answer.
 - a. Stars
 - b. Apples
 - c. It won't eat anything.
 - d. It will choose randomly.

2. When will the kodu pursue a star?
 - a. When there are no apples left.
 - b. Right after it eats its first apple.
 - c. Never.
 - d. After it bumps an apple.



3. With these rules, when will the kodu eat an apple?
 - a. When there are no stars left.
 - b. Never.
 - c. After it bumps a star.
 - d. After it eats a star.



Answer the next two questions using the same apple/star world, but with these different rules:

1	WHEN	 see	 apple	+	DO	 move	 toward	+
2	WHEN	 see	 star	+	DO	 move	 toward	+
3	WHEN	 bumped	 anything	+	DO	 eat	 it	

4. With these three rules, what will the kodu eat first? Circle your answer.

5. When will the kodu eat its first star?
